This month we resume our fall schedule of programs: Forum at 9:15 and Service at 10:30. We will have a number of guests and special observances:

On September 10, Rev. Phil Lund, Congregational Life Consultant, MidAmerica Region of UUA, returns to help us kick off the fall schedule. A flower ceremony, led by April Nielsen, will help us gather in.

September 17: Bob Hasman's daughter Leah will share her experiences as a midwife in Haiti during the forum hour.

The service homily on Universalism will be provided by Rev. Kalen Fristad. He has been a United Methodist minister for more than 40 years, and is a member of the Unitarian Universalist Christian Fellowship. He traveled the country full time with his wife, Darlene, from 2003 to 2006 accepting invitations to speak at churches, countering the teaching that many people will suffer for eternity in hell and proclaiming the hopeful message of universalism. Following then, he served churches in Iowa half time, while spending half time on the road. He retired from the parish ministry in 2013, but continues to travel the country speaking on universalism. Over the years he has spoken at more than 200 UU churches. His book on universalism, entitled; DESTINED FOR SALVATION: God's Promise to Save Everyone, and a Study Book with the same title, as well as CDs and DVDs will be available for purchase after the service.

On September 24 everyone is invited to bring a rock to renew our altar as well as stories/reflections of summer travels or activities. This observance will be the full in-gathering ritual we have traditionally followed.
