Judy asks us to consider this question: Which is a better guide through life for those of us who profess adherence to a liberal religion--emotion or reason? It's not a simple either/or choice.

On the 8<sup>th</sup> we will welcome a newcomer to our group, Daniel Frye. He is a Unitarian Universalist (UU) minister who heard his call while performing social justice work as a lawyer, representing marginalized voices, championing in particular civil rights and governmental program benefit entitlements for people with disabilities. His sermon will explore some of the autobiographical aspects of his life as a blind person, discussed in the broader context of our progressive faith tradition's radical vision of social equity and inclusion.

Dennis explains: I grew up in the era of the Civil Rights movement; many of you did, also. What happened to it? The Supreme Court, the hard work of Congress and President Johnson, not to mention the civil rights leaders, many of whom paid for it in their own precious blood... all worked to enact new laws, and to transform society.

Pat will share her personal exploration of discovery of how the ancient ideas of Stoicism provide guidance for living in our contemporary world.
